

File Types

When sending files to us for print there are several options - EPS, AI, JPEG, TIFF- but the preferred file is a pdf. When saved correctly, the use of pdf's can eliminate problems such as missing fonts and/ or images. PDF's can be saved or exported from almost any program including InDesign, Illustrator, Microsoft Office & Photoshop

Exporting a Print-Ready PDF:

Adobe InDesign

File > Export
Chose location for saved file
Format: Adobe PDF

Save

Adobe PDF Preset: High Quality

Print

Select "Marks and Bleeds"

Make sure .125" bleed is typed in all four sides

Click: Export

Microsoft Word/Publisher

File > Print
Under printer choose "Adobe PDF"
Click Print
Choose location for saved file

** Images should be no less than 150dpi for printing- 300 dpi is preferred.**

Bleed

If any part of your design prints to the edge of the document you must include a bleed in order for the document to print properly. For example, if your brochure has a background that you want to print to the edge of an $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" sheet of paper your final document size would be $8\frac{3}{4}$ " x $11\frac{1}{4}$ "

File > Document Setup > More Options

The standard bleed is 1/8" or .125. Once you add bleed a red line will be added around the document to indicate the boundaries of the bleed.

Exporting a pdf with bleed

Before you select "Export" make certain to check "Use Document Bleed Settings' under the Marks and Bleed tab.
